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

Topics to be covered are Lions Fundamental, Working in Teams, Diversity, Local Issues & Opportunities, Public Speaking, Time Management, Personal Mission Statement, Member Motivation, and Goal Setting.

PARTICIPANT QUALIFICATIONS

- 1) Candidates for this institute will be from MD C (Lions Clubs from Alberta, Northwest Territories, and NE British Columbia). This Institute will be conducted in English. Candidates must be capable of understanding and participating in the language of instruction at this institute.
- 2) Lions in good standing from clubs in good standing who have successfully served on a club committee and have not yet attained the level of Club President. Current (first time) or charter club presidents would also benefit from attending this institute. It is strongly recommended Club First Vice Presidents attend RLLI.

Multiple District C Committee Reports From February 3, 2023 Meeting

46th Annual USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum September 15-17th, 2022 Calgary

PCC Tyler Bray 2022 Host Chairperson

The Forum was hosted by the Lions of our Multiple District C. The Host committee was comprised of twenty-five Lions from Both Districts, C1 and C2.

Overall, two hundred volunteers participated in assisting with various duties required to ensure the Forum ran smoothly. It was an amazing team effort and something all Lions from our MD should be proud of.

We continue to receive praise from our current and past north American international directors, Lions Leaders, and from Lions from all walks of life. They are thanking us for our Hospitality, hard work, and an enjoyable forum.

Some of the highlights include the use of a Drone to photograph/film the Strides Walk. The Strides walk raised a total of \$12,000.00 that was donated to the Jean Nelson Diabetic Children's camp. A further \$1000.00 was donated from Canadian ID Allen Snyder's home Lions club to Camp Jean Nelson.

A service project was completed during the forum and a total of 200 bags of personal items were donated to the seven Calgary area Mustard seed locations. These items will be given to assist the homeless. Also, during the forum, the spouses of our current and past North America International directors held a session where they made twenty-five Quilted blankets. Lion Mike Janssen, from the Winnipeg area, helped raise \$750.00 by riding his bike each day of the forum. Lion Mike traditionally rides his bike to raise funds for the Canadian Lions Childhood Cancer Foundation. Both the quilted blankets and the money raised by Lion Mike were donated to the Calgary Children's Hospital foundation.

Our LEOS made their presence felt in many areas. They were polite, well dressed, and extremely helpful. Thank you, LEOS, please take a bow. The forum held over 80 learning sessions and included Lions University graduations ceremonies. A total of 1140 Lions and LEOS attended this year's forum in Calgary.

For the forum, the host committee had purchased 250 volunteer vests that were used throughout the Calgary held forum. Only one vest was lost during the whole event. As a result, we were able to sell 249 vests to the 2023 Reno Host committee.

The original MDC Host budget included \$39.400.00 in revenue and an expenditure of \$39,900.00. The revenue came in higher and their current is a surplus. Nothing is written in stone. One thought we could consider is using these funds as a start-up for the 2030 LCI Convention bid.

Overall, I am very appreciative of all the hard work our Lions committed to, to making this USA/Canada Lions Leadership forum a wonderful experience.

CLERC Report

Life at CLERC continues unabated by whatever else is happening in the outside world. Eyeglass continue to pour in and the volunteers have been fabulous to work with. To date we have held 7 Eyeglass Work Parties with 9 Lions Clubs participating. Imperial Oil retires has also done 4 Fridays of eyeglass processing with 18-20 volunteers per session.

British Petroleum annuits also continue to come in once a month on a Wednesday with a smaller but hard working group of volunteers. CLERC processes eyeglasses every Wednesday and a dedicated group continues to do an exceptional job of getting eyewear ready for shipping.

Huge amounts of gratitude to CLERC Secretary Gordon Prusky from the entire CLERC Executive for picking up the in-coming shipments of unprocessed eyeglasses from Day and Ross Transports warehouse. Day and Ross Transport deserve HUGE kudos for shipping eyewear from across Canada to CLERC for free.

Recently Bill Stecewicz, Rick Halliday and I travelled to Lethbridge where we

met up with PDG Brent Johnson and a few other volunteers that he arranged, and loaded up an entire eyeglass processing lab from retiring optician Gerry Meizei that will be shipped to Africa.

To date CLERC has shipped 64,160 pairs of glasses to 8 countries this quarter. The countries that received them are Sri Lanka (X 2), Ethiopia (X 2), the Philippines (X 4), Guatemala (X 3), Ghana, Malawi, Mexico (X 2), and Cuba.

All dates for this all of this years slate of Eyeglass Work Parties is full. Our AGM is June 24th and there will be a Zoom component and the link will be sent out to those Lions Clubs that register.

CLERC is celebrating its 20th year anniversary as a Lions initiative. We will be rolling out an information and fund raising event shortly to celebrate the volunteer success shared by District C-1 and C-2 clubs as well as those right across Canada. Stay tuned for more information moving forward in the next month.

Future project for Fort MacMurray

As many of you know, MD C had applied for a MCAT grant for the horrific fires in Ft. MacMurray. The MCAT grant is now closed, and all expenditures and monies account for.

There were other Lion's donations and public donations which were original sent to LOAF and have since been transferred over to our MD C. This money was intended for projects for the people of Ft. MacMurray.

Our MD C current has \$25,000.00, held in reserve, which was the monies turned over to us from LOAF.

I have been contacted by the Parks people from the Municipality of Wood Buffalo, seeking our support for a community project currently under way in Ft. MacMurray. Please read the enclosed message and attached photos.

Hope your summer is treating you well so far.

Parks is currently in process of building an 18-hole Disc Golf course on the North side of town in the Stonecreek community and was looking to see if MD C Lions would be interested in contributing donation funding to this project rather than towards Lions Park which was previously discussed.

The clearing for the course has been completed and Park is in the process of tendering the construction for the course elements (baskets, concrete tee pads, course signage, and landscaping/grading activities). The course will be a free amenity for the community to use and Disc golf has been gaining a lot of traction in our community.

If this is something the MD C Lions is interested in and would like to discuss further, please let me know and I can set up a meeting to provide more details. I have attached the preliminary concept to give you a better idea of the project.

Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides VDG Dave Leshchyshyn District C-1 and Multiple District LFCDG Co-ordinator

Things have been quite busy promoting LFC and The Difference Campaign over the past few months. Besides the monthly LFCDG article in the C-1 Link, I've also had articles in the District C-2 newsletter or distributed to Clubs through the C-2 Secretary.

Club visitations with the C-1 District Governor have given me many opportunities to promote the Campaign in person. Clubs have been very receptive of the information with many writing cheques to District Governor Suzanne's designated Charity of Choice (LFCDG) or handing me a cheque to be sent to the building fund. Some Clubs have even made large financial commitments that they will pay over a 5 year period. Personal presentations will continue in the coming months as the Club visitations continue. My thanks also go out to the District C-2 District Governor team. District Governor Darryl, 1VDG Kevin and 2VDG Glenn. have all been talking about the Campaign during their visitations. Many cheques from Clubs in C-2 have also been presented as LFCDG is District Governor Darryl's Charity of Choice as well. Multiple District C GMT Coordinator Report to Council February 3, 2023

The December 2022 Multiple District Health Assessment indicates total membership of 3383, this includes 152 added members. Unfortunately there were 231 dropped members for a net decrease in membership of 79 for the 6 months ending December 31. This information is only as good as the reports being submitted to LCI by the clubs. This report indicates 26% of the clubs did not submit a monthly membership report for Dec. Many of these clubs have not reported for 6 months or more. Now that we are able to meet in person and conduct in person training we believe this will improve. I took a sneak peak at Jan. numbers and as of 12:45 Jan. 31 we had a net gain of I2 for the month.

On Dec.4th PDG Brent Johnson the Area GMT and DIstrict Governors of both C1 and C2 organized, selected and invited clubs from the area to attend a Membership Summit in Olds. There were 34 in attendance. My Zone is next door to Olds and I feel we could have been better represented. Spruce View had 4 attendees including a non member, who has subsequently joined (I passed her a membership application right after she gave the report for the table). The feedback from our group was they enjoyed the Summit more than they thought they would.

Ultimately membership increase and retention falls on the club membership under direction of the membership committee and Membership Chair (if they have one) The Club Membership Chair receives emails directly from the Membership Division of LCI on a regular basis. They include suggested tasks and links to important information. ie Global Membership Approach Page, Club Membership Chairperson Page.
